This paper responds to a challenge that has continued to frustrate workers attempting to intervene to support women and children living with DFV. Effects of early parenting interventions on parents and infants

A recent review suggests that early parenting interventions improve parental responsiveness and prevent infant sleep problems. Parenting interventions conducted during pregnancy or before a child's first birthday significantly improve parental responsiveness and prevent infant sleep problems, according to a recent systematic review published in the Journal of Child and Family Studies.
